Merrick Cohee, aged 31 years, of J. W. and Amelia Whiteside, was murdered early Sunday morning, July 27, near his home, at 57th and Woodland Ave.

He had spent the last ten years in Philadelphia and had become an efficient electrical worker and at the time of his death was an electric welder. He had studied and completed several courses in the work.

The evening of his death had been spent at his home with three fellow workmen in practicing music, which was their usual habit.

After the company left he went to a nearby restaurant to get some dainties for himself, wife and child and was last seen talking to the fellows who had left the home and been loitering nearby. After leaving the house something happened very quickly without any eye witness, so far as is known.

His body was found Monday morning in Morton's coal yard one-half a square from his home. He was robbed of a diamond and garnet stone ring and a white gold wrist watch, together with a sum of money.

His parents were notified and left for Philadelphia and brought his body to their home. Services were held on the following Thursday by Revs. Warren, of Baltimore, and Miller, of Federalburg. The body was laid to rest in the family lot in Grove cemetery. He leaves to mourn his wife and two small children, a sister, Philadelphia, and father, mother and brother, near Preston.
